The collection of date would require funds that would be used by ARAI and other laboratories along with OEMs for this purpose. It was mentioned that recently India is required to generate data for WLTP, as India is also chairing this group. In case this particular data is not presented to WP 29 in time, there is a danger that regulations would be framed based on other data cycles and this would also be embarrassing as India is the chair for this group.
