## I Bharat Heavy Electricals Ltd. (BHEL)

### Order booking:

- Order booking has reached Rs.39,028 Crore as on January 2010 wherein:
  - Order booking in Power Sector reached Rs.29,201 crore mark at the end of January, 2010, which includes orders worth Rs 777.68 crore booked during January, 2010.
  - Order booking in Industry Sector comprising of Captive Power & other Industrial products reached Rs.8024crore upto end January, 2010. #### III Seminar organized by Department of Heavy Industry

A National Seminar on Energy Efficiency and Energy Audit was organized ٠ by Department of Heavy Industry on 27.1.2010 at SCOPE Complex, New Delhi in consultation with Bureau of energy Efficiency (BEE), The Energy & Resources Institute (TERI) with a view to formulate a comprehensive Energy Efficiency Plan for the PSEs under this Department. All the PSEs under the Department of Heavy Industry participated in this seminar. The Seminar was addressed by a number of prominent speakers from Bureau of Energy Efficiency, National Productivity Council, DSCL, Energy Services Company, Senergy Global Limited, Project Management Association and also by senior executives of some of PSEs under DHI. This Seminar aimed at providing an excellent opportunity for the PSE's apprise themselves of the need. management to scope and implementation issues involved in Energy Efficient Programme including the aspect of carbon credit/clean development mechanism (CDM) where they can earn credit for the energy saved. The Seminar would also result in drawing up a time bound; clear road map for undertaking energy audits in all the PSEs to be followed by the implementation of energy efficiency in right earnest.

### **IV Auto Sector**

 The 3<sup>rd</sup> biggest Auto-Expo in the world was held in New Delhi from 5<sup>th</sup> to 11<sup>th</sup> January, 2010. There was enthusiastic participation from manufacturers of automobiles, auto components etc. on an unprecedented level. A record 10 global launches, over 50 India launches of new vehicles as well as nearly 100 variants of existing models were seen at this expo.

 Minister (HI&PE) in the presence of Assam State Minister for Industries and Urban Development inaugurated the NATRIP facilities at Dholchura (Silichar) completed at cost of Rs. 43.19 crore.
