I Bharat Heavy Electricals Ltd. (BHEL)

(a) Order booking:

The total order receipts in the current financial year up-to January'2013 has reached a level of **Rs. 14,854 Crs.** which include orders worth **Rs. 4,162 Crs.** secured during January'2013.

The cumulative turnover of NBPPL is `80.83 crore up to January, 2013 in the current financial year.

III Automotive Sector:

The meeting of National Council for Electric Mobility (NCEM) under the Chairmanship of Minister (HI&PE) was held on 29.08.2012 in New Delhi wherein the National Council for

Electric Mobility (NCEM) has approved National Electric Mobility Mission Plan (NEMMP) 2020, which provides a roadmap for hybrid and electric transportation in the country. Hon'ble Prime Minister has unveiled the National Electric Mobility Mission Plan (NEMMP), 2020 on 09.01.2013 in New Delhi. A demonstration of electric/hybrid cars and two wheelers was also arranged at the venue. The unveiling of the National Electric Mobility Mission Plan 2020 by the Hon'ble Prime Minister has given a very encouraging signal to the automotive sector and to the people of India in general, as it leads to the onset of coordinated efforts of the Government as well as the industry, in collaboration with the academia and the scientific fraternity, to move towards reducing the dependence on fossil fuel in a significant way. This will also provide a boost to indigenization of the electric mobility industry, while reducing the overall vehicular emission level.

IV Performance of major PSEs

A brief tabular statement on the performance of some of the major CPSEs under the Department of Heavy Industry is enclosed at Annex-I. The production of these companies during **December**, **2012** was 3.05% higher as compared to the corresponding period last year.
