**BS-VI Standard for Auto Industry**

5096. SHRI KUNDARIYA MOHAN BHAI KALYANJI BHAI:

Will the Minister of HEAVY INDUSTRIES AND PUBLIC ENTERPRISES be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the Government has directed Auto industry to migrate to BS-VI standard by 2020;
- (b) if so, the details thereof and the response of the industry thereto;
- (c) whether the industry has sought an extension of the deadline to dispose of BS-IV inventory and move to BS-VI standards; and
- (d) if so, the details thereof and the reaction of the Government thereto?

**ANSWER**

**MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HEAVY INDUSTRIES AND  
PUBLIC ENTERPRISES (SHRI BABUL SUPRIYO)**

(a) & (b): Ministry of Road Transport and Highways vide their notification No. GSR 889(E) dated 16<sup>th</sup> September, 2016 has mandated all vehicles to comply to BS VI emission norms manufactured on or after 1<sup>st</sup> April, 2020.

(c) & (d): Government has given 3 / 6 months' time to clear BS IV inventory vide Notification No. 178(E) dated 28<sup>th</sup> February 2018 issued by Ministry of Road Transport and Highways where-in, new motor vehicles conforming to Emission Standard Bharat Stage IV, manufactured before the 1<sup>st</sup> April, 2020 shall not be registered after the 30<sup>th</sup> June, 2020. Provided that the new motor vehicles of categories M and N conforming to Emission Standard Bharat Stage IV, manufactured before the 1<sup>st</sup> April, 2020 and sold in the form of drive away chassis, shall not be registered after 30<sup>th</sup> September, 2020.
