Monitoring safety defects of car manufacturers

2665. SHRI CHUNIBHAI KANJIBHAI GOHEL:

Will the Minister of HEAVY INDUSTRIES AND PUBLIC ENTERPRISES be pleased to state:

- (a) whether it is a fact that Government has received complaints against a leading automobile company for emission norms and other manufacturing defects in their cars;
- (b) if so, what action Government has taken on the complaints received in this regard;
- (c) whether Government do not have any legal framework with regard to defective vehicles or their standardization; and
- (d) if so, what steps Government proposes to take for setting up of a regulator for strictly monitoring the safety defects of car manufacturers?
