Heavy Industries in Rajasthan

1589. SHRI RAHUL KASWAN:

Will the Minister of HEAVY INDUSTRIES AND PUBLIC ENTERPRISES be pleased to state:

- (a) the details of heavy industries and public enterprises functioning in Rajasthan; and
- (b) the annual turnover and the profit/ loss earned/suffered by such industries/ enterprises during the past several years and the impact thereof on the economy of the State?

ANSWER

MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HEAVY INDUSTRIES AND PUBLIC ENTERPRISES (SHRI G.M. SIDDESHWARA)

(a): Industry is a state subject, hence no centralized data is maintained in this Department for heavy industries and public enterprises functioning in various States/UT's of the country. The role of Department of Heavy Industry (DHI) is confined to administration of Central Public Sector Enterprises (CPSEs) under its administrative Control. There are 4 CPSEs having registered office in Rajasthan under the administrative control of this Department. These are Sambar Salts Limited (SSL), Hindustan Salts Limited (HSL), Rajasthan Electronics (India) Limited (REIL), Instrumentation Limited, Kota (ILK).

(b): The Annual Turnover and Profit/Loss account for the last 3 financial years of CPSEs including CPSEs in the State are available in Statement No. 15 & 3 of Volume No.1 of Public Enterprises Survey 2012-13 already laid on the table of the House of Parliament on 20.2.2014. As per above survey, the Annual Turnover of and Profit/Loss of above 4 CPSEs is as under:
