#### **Safety Rating of Vehicles**

99. PROF. SAUGATA ROY:

Will the Minister of HEAVY INDUSTRIES AND PUBLIC ENTERPRISES be pleased to state:

- (a) whether it is a fact that some models of leading car manufacturers of the country have failed crash tests, showing "high risk of life-threatening injuries with the cars receiving zero-star safety rating for their adult occupant protection";
- (b) if so, the details thereof and the reaction of the Government thereto; and
- (c) the details of the directions issued by the Government to the car manufacturers in this regard?

(a) to (c): The Government has not received any reports regarding failure of any car models in the crash tests. However, Global Plan for the Decade for Road Safety 2011-2020, developed by UN Road Safety Collaboration, encourages implementation of new car assessment proprammes in all regions of the world. A committee has been set up by the Ministry of Road Transport & Highway to analyse the need for safety rating system in India and related aspects thereof.
